Peer reviews are a good way to learn from other teachers. In Flanders the local EDINA team promoted peer reviews by presenting them to the NAM-schools in the form of an 'NAM Tinder'. Here is the promotion text the team used to persuade the schools to join.

"In the framework of the Erasmus+ project *EDINA Go Pro*, which aims at stronger education for NAM-students, we took the initiative to look for more exchange and peer review opportunities within Flanders between NAM-schools in Antwerp, Brussels, Leuven and Ghent. During an initial meeting, one of the ideas that emerged was to offer NAM-teachers the opportunity to exchange or switch with a colleague from another school in another city. Building upon that idea we came up with the NAM-TINDER, to which we would now like to invite you!

Then we ask you as an individual teacher or you as a school to fill in the form below and send it to us. We will then forward your proposal to the participating schools in the 4 cities, who can respond if they are interested. If there is a match, you and the school can make further arrangements.
